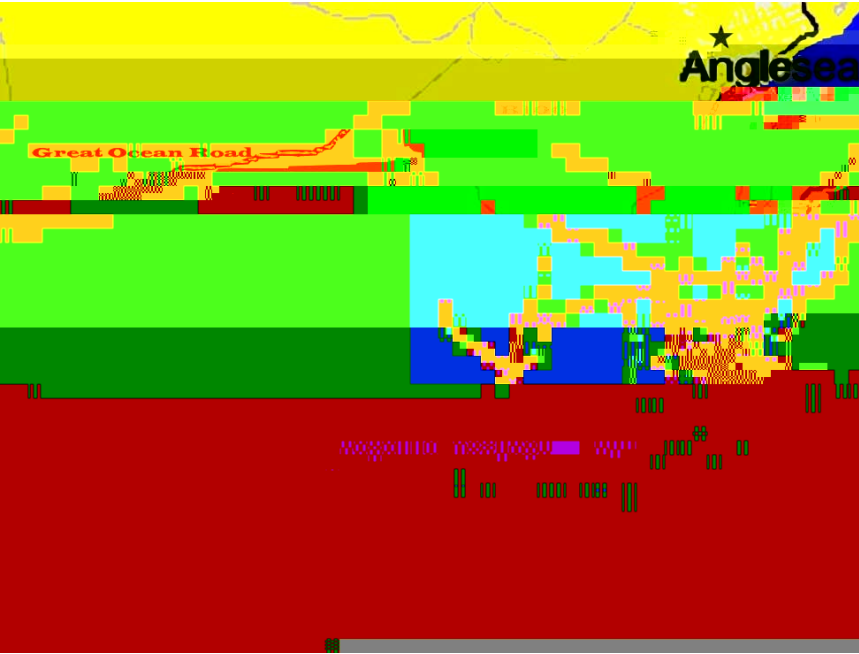

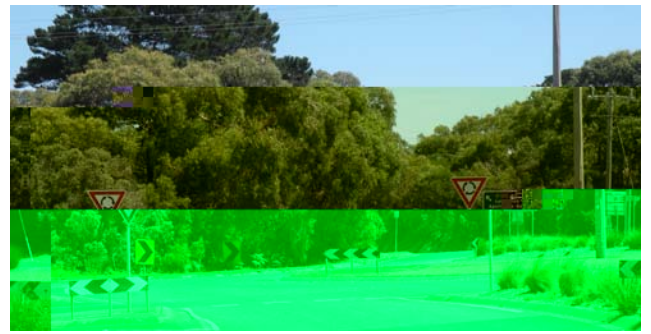

Distances Start at Roundabout Below



Distances start from the roundabout just past the Anglesea shops. Approximately 1.5 km past the roundabout the Great Ocean Road climbs a hill above the Anglesea Surf Club. There are two good lookouts here. One is on the Great Ocean Road above the Surf Club and gives excellent views back along the coast to Torquay and to Point Roadknight, whilst the other is on the hill above the Great Ocean Road accessed via Harvey Street. Harvey Street is the second turn to the right (approximately parallel to the Great Ocean Road) after the 90-degree bend the Great Ocean Road takes on leaving the Anglesea River.

The Great Ocean Road follows the coast until near Aireys Inlet where it goes inland for approximately 3 km. Between Anglesea and Urquharts Bluff there are numerous car parks that provide excellent views and beach access. Some of these car parks provide excellent photographs of the Aireys Inlet lighthouse. Urquharts Bluff lookout 7.3 km passed Anglesea has a car park on the Great Ocean Road and is probably the best lookout on this section of the road.

Past Aireys Inlet the Great Ocean Road follows the water to Fairhaven

Side Trips

Anglesea

Point Roadknight turn off is located 2.5 km past Anglesea. It is a short 1.6 km drive to car park. The rock formation here are very photogenic and it gives an interesting view of the coast. Allow 45 minutes for this side trip includes walking along the beach. Return to Great Ocean Road the way you came.

Aireys Inlet

The lighthouse at Split Point is a must see along the Great Ocean Road. It is normally accessed via a left turn into Inlet Crescent and left into Lighthouse Road approximately 1 km past town ship of Aireys Inlet however this can get very busy and parking can be difficult. By continuing another 400metres along the Great Ocean Road and turning left into the other end of Inlet Crescent and continuing into Reserve Road you will come to a car park on the Southside of the lighthouse. It is a short walk to the lighthouse and the viewing area for Eagle Rock. Allow around 45 minutes for this side trip. Back track to the Great Ocean Road.
